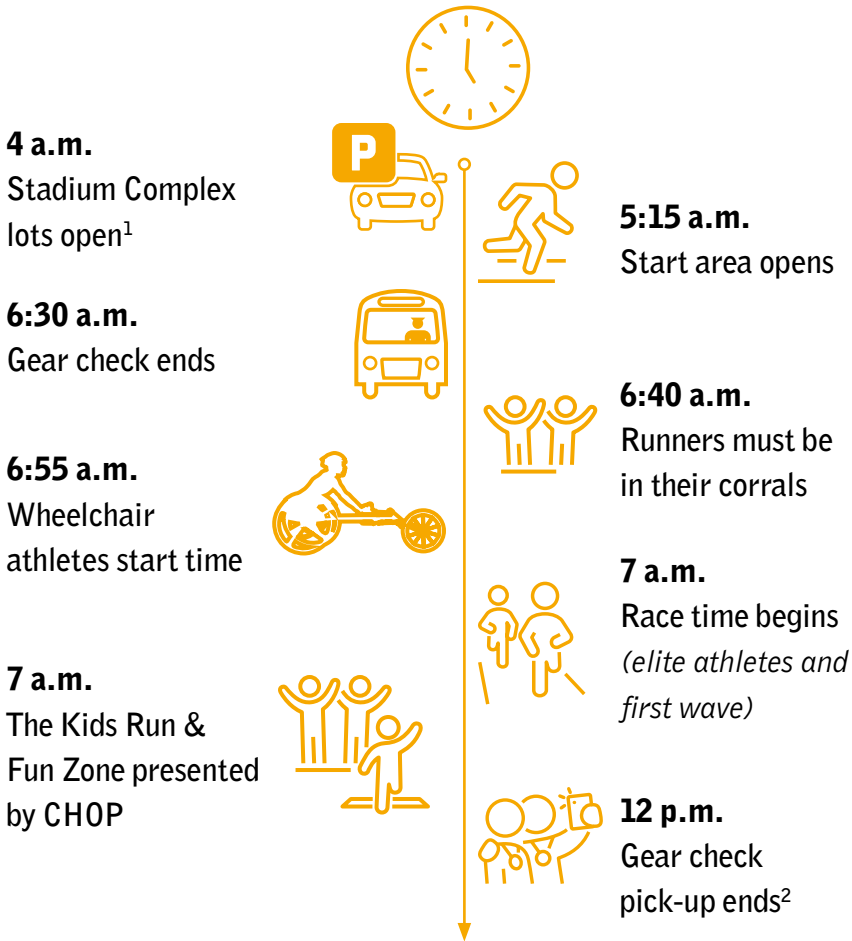

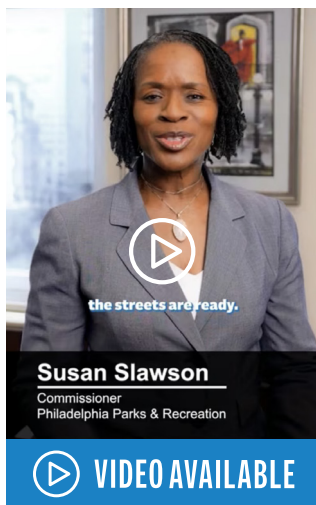
This race brings out the best of Philadelphia—grit, resilience, and unbreakable community spirit. Every step toward the Navy Yard is a testament to the determination that defines our city.

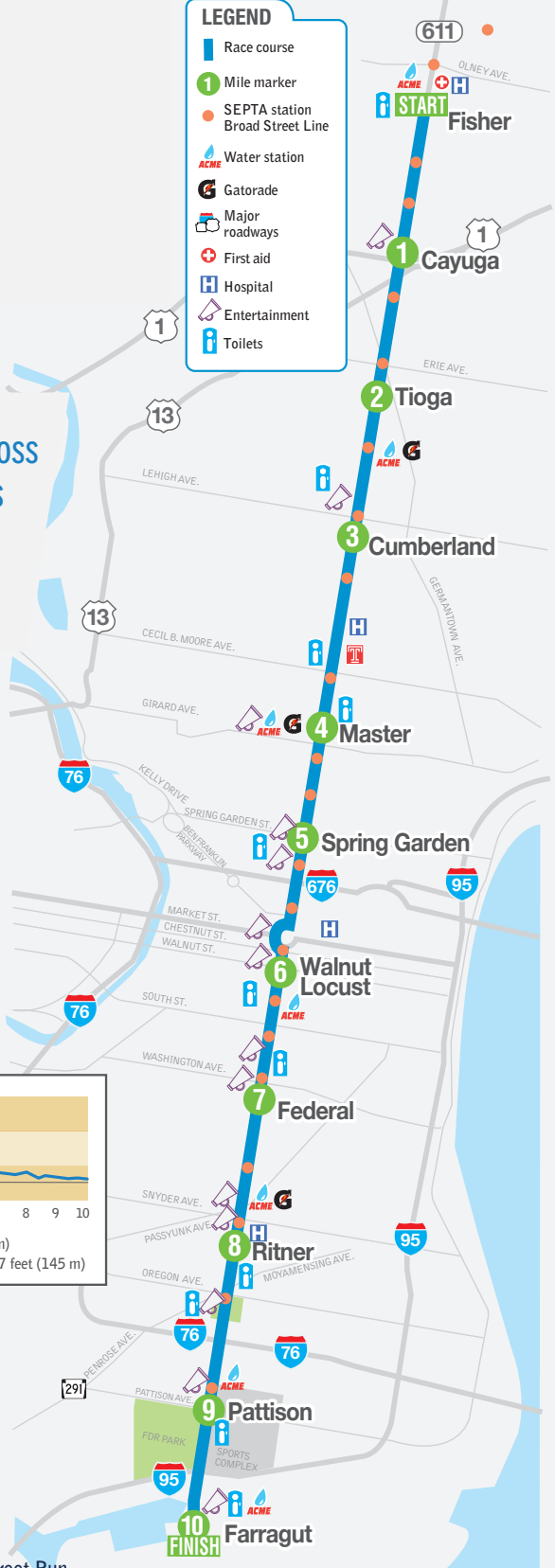

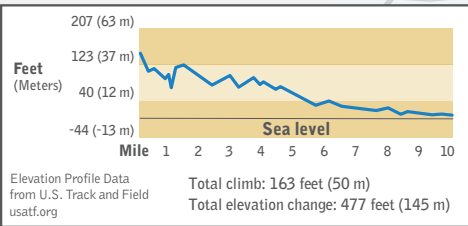
The Independence Blue Cross Broad Street Run course is 10 miles, point-to-point. *Runner's World* named it one of the fastest 10-mile courses in the country.

How are you getting to the start?

I'm coming from within the city

Take the B (formerly the Broad Street Line), it's your best option!

- FREE with your race bib
- Board at any station and ride north to Olney Transportation Center (start area)
- Trains run frequently; expect crowds

If you're walking from nearby neighborhoods:

- Follow signs for Central High School Athletic Field
- Allow extra time for security and corrals

I'm coming from the suburbs or New Jersey

Regional Rail ➡ Broad Street Line

- Take Regional Rail to Suburban Station
- Transfer to the B Line at City Hall and ride north to Olney Transportation Center (start area)

PATCO (from NJ)

- Ride PATCO to 12th/13th & Locust Streets
- Walk 2 blocks west ➡ Broad & Locust Streets
- Enter B Line and ride to Olney Transportation Center (start area)



I need to drive and park

DO NOT drive to the start area (no parking permitted)



Option A: Park at the Stadium Complex (Recommended)

- Parking is **FREE**
- Lots open at 4 a.m. and close when they're full
- Take the B north from NRG Station to Olney Transportation Center (start area)
- Return to the lots post race using free shuttles
- No parking is allowed on Pattison Avenue, Broad Street, Olney Avenue, or Old York Road

Option B: Park in Center City

- Use any downtown garage
- Walk to a B station and ride north to Olney Transportation Center

I'm using rideshare

Start area drop-off zones only:

- Broad Street & Chew Avenue
- Ogontz & Somerville Avenues



Driver tips:

- Drivers cannot enter restricted streets near the start area.
- Arrive early; closures happen quickly.
- Keep car clear of race route barricades.

Important: I-95 South detour



The Walt Whitman Bridge/Packer Avenue Exit on I-95 South is **CLOSED** for construction.

During the race please use the following detour:

1. Take Exit 20 Columbus Blvd./ Washington Ave.
2. Turn right onto Columbus Blvd.
3. Continue on Columbus Blvd. until it becomes Pattison Ave.
4. Proceed to the Stadium Complex and park in any open lot.

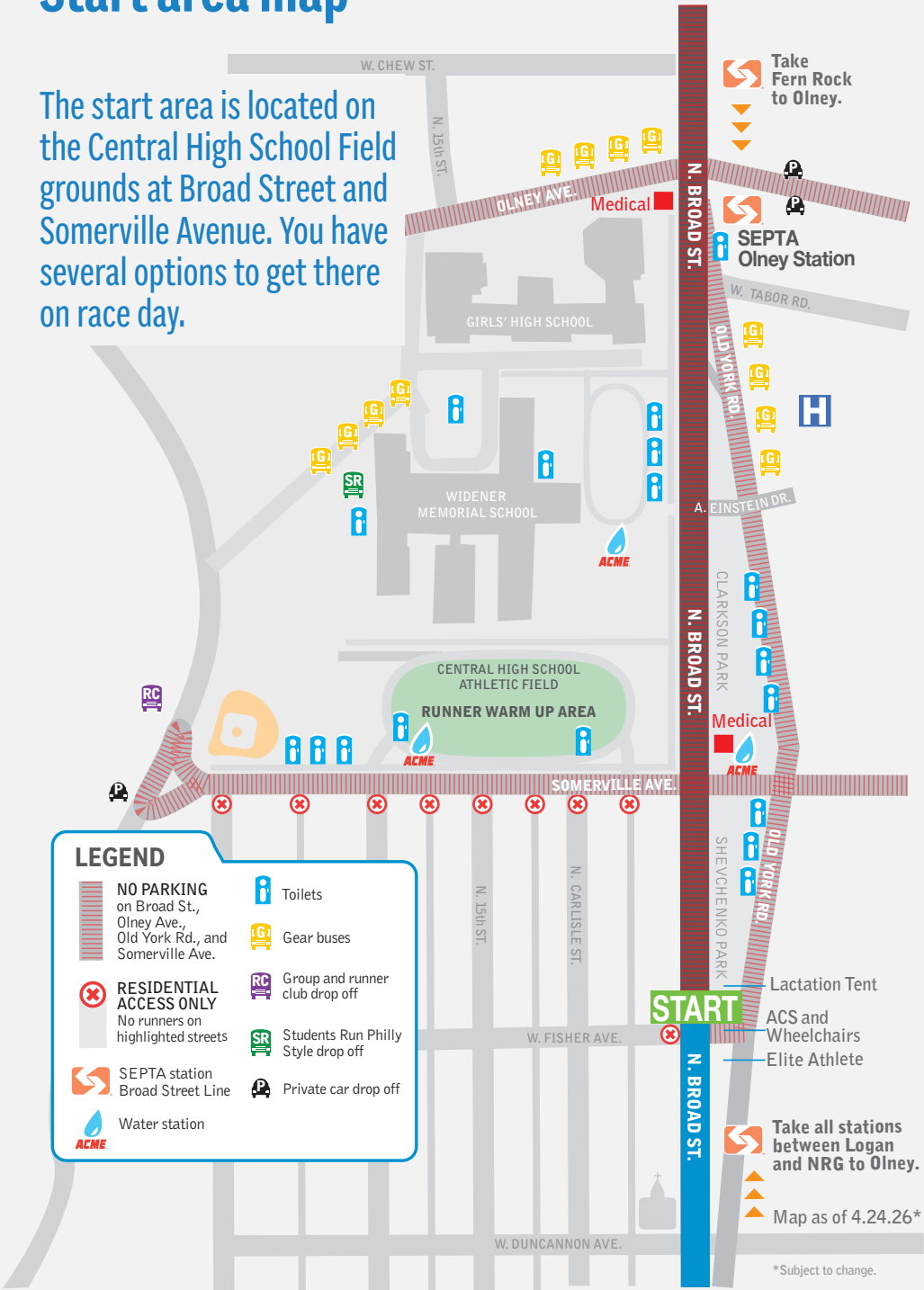

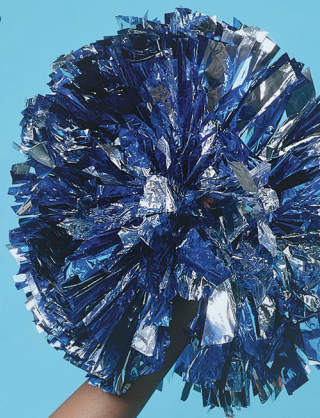

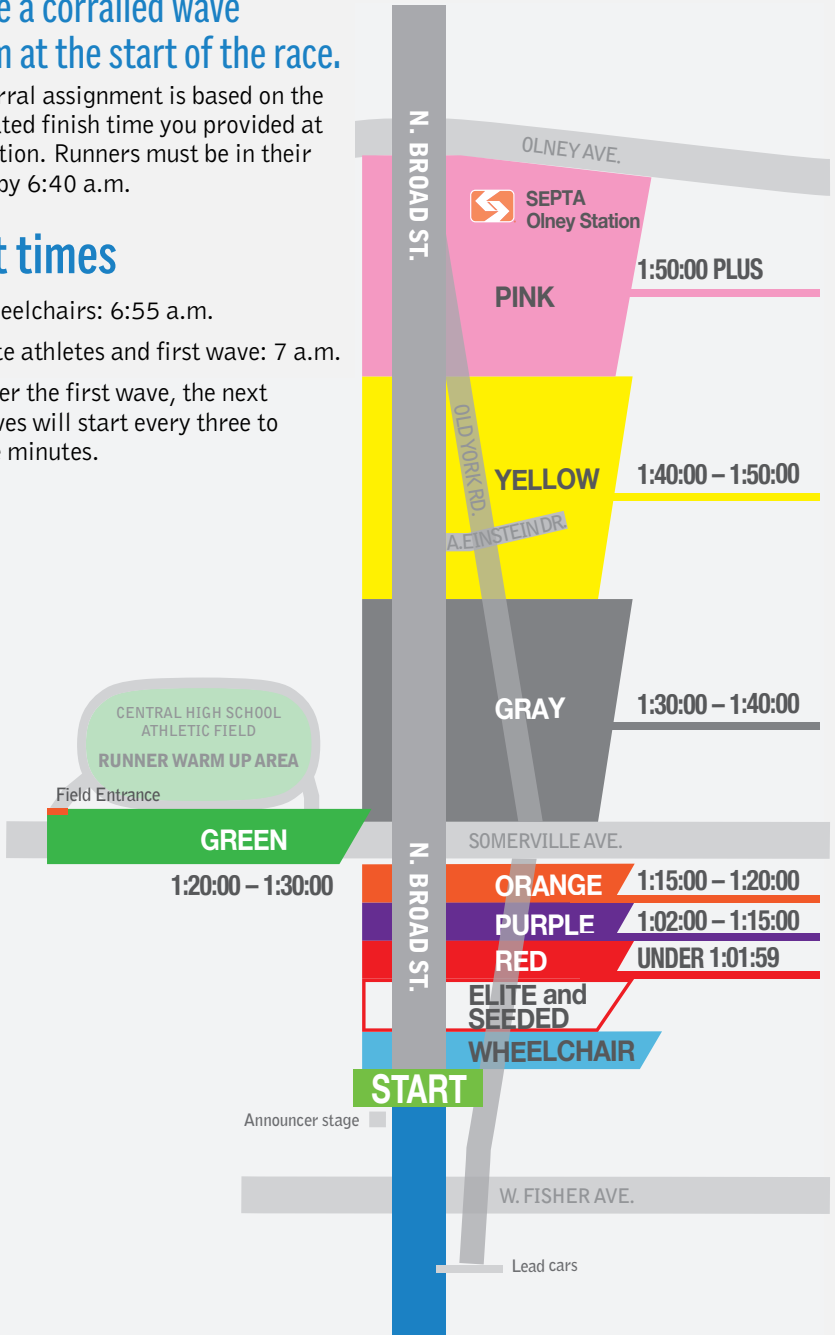
Start corrals

We use a corralled wave system at the start of the race.

Your corral assignment is based on the anticipated finish time you provided at registration. Runners must be in their corrals by 6:40 a.m.

Start times

- Wheelchairs: 6:55 a.m.
- Elite athletes and first wave: 7 a.m.
- After the first wave, the next waves will start every three to five minutes.

Race day essentials

Here is everything you need to know to make the most of your race experience.



Gear check

FREE | Clear bags only | Closes at 6:30 a.m.

Use the clear plastic bag you received at the Expo to check your gear at the start area.

How it works

1. Add ID (name, address, phone number) inside your bag.
2. Go to a gear check bus on Olney Avenue, Old York Road, or Widener Drive in the start area. (See maps on page 14.)
3. Attach one wristband to your bag and give it to a volunteer.
4. Keep the matching wristband and sticker — you'll need them to reclaim your bag.
5. Note your bus number (bags are not sorted by bib number).
6. Pick up your bag in the finish area. (See maps on pages 24 and 25.)

Important

- Clear bags only — no backpacks or loose items
- For the safety of everyone, all bags are subject to inspection
- Items left at the start area will be discarded

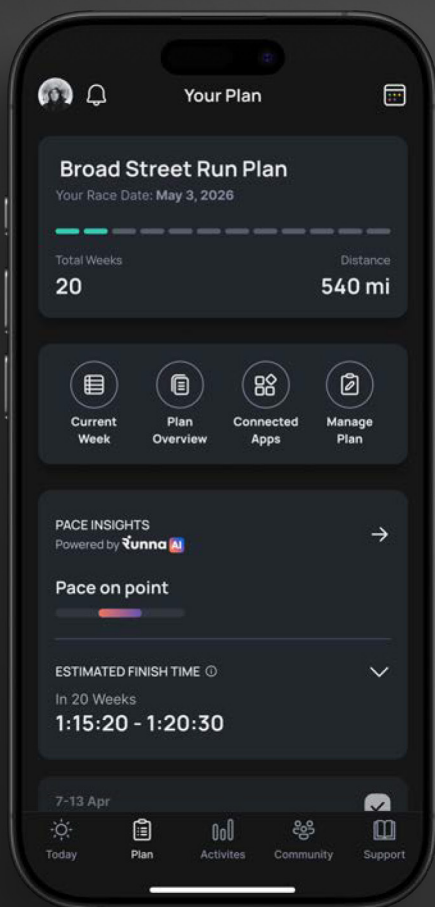

Finish line area

After you finish the race, be sure to keep moving. Grab refreshments, your medal, and find your loved ones!

Refreshments

Remove the food tag from your bib and give it to the volunteers in the refreshment tent to receive a refreshment packet. Our preparations included one of each item per runner.

Medal distribution

All medals will be distributed at the rear of each refreshment tent.

Exiting the finish line area

Exit the finish at the designated exit points.



Shuttles

You can take a shuttle bus from right outside the Navy Yard main gate to the stadium complex parking lots and NRG Station. The last shuttle will depart the Navy Yard at 12 p.m.

Designated pick-up area and rideshare

The designated pick-up location is the P Lot next to Citizens Bank Park. Have your ride enter P Lot from the 7th Street gate. If P Lot is full, your ride can park on 7th Street between Pattison and Packer Avenues. Drivers must always remain with their vehicles. Any vehicle left unattended will be towed immediately.

Temple University – N. Broad Street and Montgomery Ave.

N. Broad and Spring Garden Streets

City Hall – 15th and Market Streets

Join our Center City residents as they cheer on all runners around Philly's iconic landmark in the heart of the city. It's also an easy spot to get through by public transportation.

Kimmel Center – S. Broad and Spruce Streets

Gather around the centerpiece of the "Avenue of the Arts" where there is plenty of room on sidewalks to cheer on your favorite runners.

Ivy Rehab – S. Broad Street, between McKean and Mifflin Streets

Join the great team from Ivy Rehab, our Health and Wellness Expo sponsor, as they show all the runners their support.

American Cancer Society – S. Broad and Hartranft Streets

Come out and join the great folks from the American Cancer Society at the Mission Mile.



Pro tips for spectators

- Public transportation is the easiest way to get around on race day.
- Expect street closures along Broad Street during the race.
- Arrive early for popular spots like City Hall.
- Plan a postrace meetup location in advance.
- Make a sign to help support the runners.



Track a runner

Your loved ones can track you along the course, so they know exactly when to expect you at their viewing spot. They will receive alerts at miles 3, 5, 7, and the finish line. Register at broadstretrun.com/tracking.

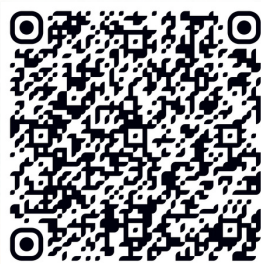

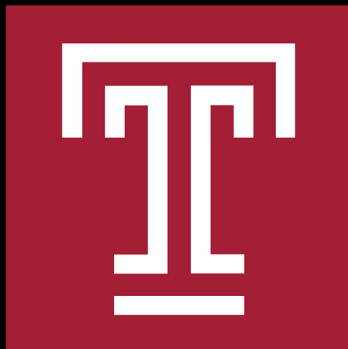
